



Executive Order 2014-22

ORDERING FLAGS TO HALF-STAFF

WHEREAS, State of Nevada Assemblyman Joseph "Joe" M. Hogan died on Friday, October 17, 2014, at the age of 77;

WHEREAS, Assemblyman Hogan was born in Fort Dodge, Iowa on August 10, 1937;

WHEREAS, Assemblyman Hogan served as an officer in the United States Navy, and later earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Notre Dame, and a Juris Doctorate degree from Georgetown University;

WHEREAS, Assemblyman Hogan was first elected to the Nevada State Legislature in 2004, where he represented the citizens of Clark County and served thereafter during five regular and seven special sessions until his death;

WHEREAS, Assemblyman Hogan was a passionate, kind, and determined legislator, who fought for the rights of all Nevadans, and our State is a better place due to his distinguished service;

WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife, Sandy, and their children and grandchildren;


WHEREAS, Article 5, Section 1 of the Nevada Constitution provides: "The supreme executive power of this State, shall be vested in a Chief Magistrate who shall be Governor of the State of Nevada."

NOW, THEREFORE, by the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Nevada and the United States, it is hereby ordered as follows:

The flags of the United States and the State of Nevada shall be flown at half-staff at the State Capitol and all state public buildings and grounds on Tuesday, October 21, 2014, from sunrise to sunset, in honor of Assemblyman Hogan.


