

Executive Order 2014-23

ORDERING FLAGS TO HALF-STAFF

WHEREAS, former State of Nevada Assemblyman Peter "Pete" L. Livermore died on Monday, October 20, 2014, at the age of 73;

WHEREAS, Assemblyman Livermore was born in New Orleans, Louisiana in 1941;

WHEREAS, Assemblyman Livermore served as an officer in the United States Marine Corps, and later became a businessman in Carson City;

WHEREAS, Assemblyman Livermore spent countless hours serving the community of Carson City through his commitment to youth sports, service and leadership on numerous public service boards and commissions, and as the Mayor Pro Tempore of Carson City for the years 2004-06;

WHEREAS, Assemblyman Livermore was elected to the Nevada State Legislature in 2010, where he was respected and well-known for his passion and kindness;

WHEREAS, Assemblyman Livermore leaves behind a legacy that has touched the lives of children and families throughout Northern Nevada;

WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife, Laurie, and their three children;

WHEREAS, Article 5, Section 1 of the Nevada Constitution provides: "The supreme executive power of this State, shall be vested in a Chief Magistrate who shall be Governor of the State of Nevada."

NOW, THEREFORE, by the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Nevada and the United States, it is hereby ordered as follows:

The flags of the United States and the State of Nevada shall be flown at half-staff at the State Capitol and all state public buildings and grounds on Wednesday, October 22, 2014, from sunrise to sunset, in honor of Assemblyman Livermore.




