



A Proclamation by the Governor

WHEREAS, the community of Glenbrook was one of the first settlements at Lake Tahoe and has played a significant role in the history of the State of Nevada; and

WHEREAS, at the time of Nevada's admission to the United States of America, Glenbrook was the key mill site on the shores of Lake Tahoe for processing the timber that was needed by Virginia City's silver mining operations: operations that were vital to the Battle Born State of Nevada; and

WHEREAS, Glenbrook was the site where the great Mark Twain first viewed Lake Tahoe and wrote in *Roughing It* that "It must surely be the fairest picture the whole earth affords."; and

WHEREAS, Nevada's first golf course was developed in Glenbrook in 1926: the course has been played by professional golfers and is still in operation, to the great enjoyment of many Nevadans and visitors from all over the world; and

WHEREAS, Glenbrook remains an active, vibrant community on the Nevada shores of Lake Tahoe; and

WHEREAS, it is with great pride and appreciation that during Nevada's Sesquicentennial Year, I recognize and join with all citizens of the State of Nevada in celebrating Glenbrook's unique history and heritage;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, BRIAN SANDOVAL, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, do hereby proclaim August 1, 2014, as

GLENBROOK DAY
