



A Proclamation by the Governor

WHEREAS, on October 23, 1914, Marian Myrtle Maddaford was born at home in East Ely, Nevada, to William and Florence Maddaford who were recent immigrants from Plymouth, England; and

WHEREAS, Marian attended White Pine County schools in Ruth and Ely from kindergarten through high school, and upon graduation in 1932, took employment with the Works Progress Administration in Ely, Nevada; and

WHEREAS, Marian and George Joseph Miles of Ely were married in 1938 and relocated to Carson City, Nevada, where George worked for the Highway Department and Marian became a housewife; and

WHEREAS, Marian later gave birth to three children, David, Joyce, and Daniel; and

WHEREAS, Marian began her state career in 1952 at the Nevada Industrial Commission as a cashier in the Cashiering Department; and

WHEREAS, Marian continued raising her family as a widow after the untimely death of her husband from cancer in 1964; and

WHEREAS, Marian retired from state service in 1974, and has continued to reside in Carson City; and

WHEREAS, throughout her life Marian has enjoyed many travels with her sister Joyce and friends, visiting England, Australia, New Zealand, Panama, Alaska, and numerous destinations in the United States and Canada; and

WHEREAS, on October 23, 2014, Marian Maddaford Miles turns 100 years old and has earned this recognition for her devotion to family, friends, and the state of Nevada;
