



A Proclamation by the Governor

WHEREAS, Nevada was admitted to the Union one hundred and fifty-one years ago on October 31, 1864; and

WHEREAS, Nevada played a most important part in the closing days of the civil war that divided our country from 1861 to 1864; and

WHEREAS, the 31st day of October of each year has, by custom and by law, been set aside as Nevada Day for the purpose of celebrating through appropriate means, the anniversary of the admission of Nevada into the Union of States composing our nation; and

WHEREAS, it is most fitting and proper that such an anniversary be observed by the people of Nevada in remembrance of its historic admission into the Union that gave our beloved State its appellation, "The Battle Born State," and;

WHEREAS, the theme of this year's Nevada Day celebration, on October 31st, is "Nevada, One State Many Cultures," and;

WHEREAS, Jack Waggon and Sherry Rupert have been chosen as Co-Grand Marshals to honor the many and diverse cultures of the State of Nevada;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, BRIAN SANDOVAL, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, do hereby proclaim October 31, 2015, as
