



A Proclamation by the Governor

WHEREAS, Complex Regional Pain Syndrome (CRPS), also known as Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy (RSD) is a nerve disorder that is progressive and does not currently have a cure; and

WHEREAS, the symptoms of CRPS are often described as a burning that is out of proportion to the severity of the initial injury and can include swelling and extreme sensitivity to the touch; and

WHEREAS, while CRPS was first identified during the Civil War, it remains a poorly understood condition; and

WHEREAS, throughout the month, members of the CRPS community will be spreading awareness about the disorder. On November 2, 2015 they will be celebrating the second annual Color The World Orange Day to spread awareness of this poorly understood pain disorder;
