



A Proclamation by the Governor

WHEREAS, Michael Gyll began his state career in April 1992 at the Nevada Highway Patrol (NHP) Academy, and graduated as a Trooper in September 1992 and was promoted to a Trooper II in Sept. 1993; and

WHEREAS, Trooper Michael Gyll earned the "Award of Excellence" in January 1994 by the Nevada Highway Patrol for Outstanding Achievement in the area of Occupant Protection Enforcement and Trooper of the Year in June 1998 by the Minden Elks Lodge #2670; and

WHEREAS, Trooper Michael Gyll was awarded the Gold Medal of Valor for "Outstanding Service Above and Beyond," in May 1999, and the Purple Heart for injuries sustained during the Brian Speaker Shooting in February, 1999. The following week he was awarded the Memorial Plaque given to officers who are survivors for "Service Above and Beyond the Call of Duty"; and

WHEREAS, Trooper Michael Gyll transferred to the Training Division in June 2001 and served as the Firearms Coordinator for all new cadets; and

WHEREAS, Trooper Michael Gyll returned to the Nevada Highway Patrol in January 2003. During this time, he was awarded two Certificates of Appreciation by Director Togliatti for his voluntary deployment to the Hurricane Disaster area in Mississippi and for humanitarian work in the aftermath of Katrina. In December 2005, he received the State of Mississippi, Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 506 and a letter of appreciation from Senator Tommy Robertson for service during Hurricane Katrina; and

WHEREAS, Trooper Michael Gyll transferred to the Investigation Division in December 2006, as a DPS Officer II, was promoted to Sergeant in November 2007, and assigned to oversee Tri-NET in August 2008. He continued his role as the Training and Firearms Coordinator of the Investigation Division; and Whereas; Sergeant Michael Gyll was promoted to Lieutenant in March 2011, and subsequently graduated from the Northwestern University School for Police, Staff and Command in August 2011; and


WHEREAS, Lt. Michael Gyll will officially retire June 27, 2013, after a distinguished career with over 21 years of state service; and


WHEREAS, Michael Gyll's colleagues and friends extend their best wishes for health, happiness and prosperity in his retirement and future endeavors;
