



A Proclamation by the Governor

WHEREAS, Trinity Methodist Church was formally organized October 6, 1963, with about two hundred people in attendance; and

WHEREAS, on January 5, 1964, the charter member rolls were closed, and 259 Charter Members joined the new church; and

WHEREAS, services were held at the Red Rock Southern Baptist facilities until Easter Sunday 1964, when Trinity moved to the Charleston Heights Shopping Center; and

WHEREAS, the land located at Charleston and Jones was purchased by First Methodist Church in 1959, but at that time, the property was viewed as too remote. In 1961, Dr. Douglas Harrell, pastor of First Methodist Church, determined that the property was in an area of critical development and from that, he became instrumental in the creation of Trinity Methodist Church; and

WHEREAS, in 1964, the property was deeded over to Trinity Methodist Church. The groundbreaking was held May 9, 1965; and the new church buildings were first used for worship services on November 7, 1965; and

WHEREAS, from its beginning in 1963 until 1968, the church was called Trinity Methodist Church; and

WHEREAS, following the merger of the Methodist Church and the Evangelical United Brethren Church in 1968, the church became Trinity United Methodist Church; and

WHEREAS, on October 6, 2013, Trinity United Methodist Church will celebrate its 50 year anniversary;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, BRIAN SANDOVAL, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, do hereby proclaim October 6, 2013 as

TRINITY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH DAY IN NEVADA
