


ORDER REGARDING WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, this administration has led a five-year effort to diversify Nevada's economy and create new, high-quality jobs throughout the State;

WHEREAS, job creation in innovative sectors of the economy, together with an economic recovery in the traditional industries of Nevada, is leading to the emergence of new economic and employment opportunities in the Silver State;

WHEREAS, a highly-skilled, diverse workforce is critical to the success of new companies seeking employees in the technology, advanced manufacturing, education, and health care sectors;

Employment Opportunities and Workforce Development

Advanced Manufacturing

- Largest economic development sector: 17,000 jobs
 - 37 percent of assisted jobs
- 66 percent below National average
- Learn and Earn Career Pathway (LEAP): Advanced Manufacturing
- Workforce Innovation for the New Nevada (WINN)

Technology

- Second largest economic development sector: 13,600 jobs
 - 30 percent of assisted jobs
- 29 percent below National average
- LEAP Career Pathway: Advanced Information Communications Technologies

Employment Opportunities and Workforce Development

Health Care

- Fourth largest economic development sector: 2,200 jobs
 - Five percent of assisted jobs
- 33 percent below National average
- Only sector not affected by Great Recession
- LEAP Career Pathway: Life Sciences and Health Care

Education

- 32 percent below National average
- Education and training for the New Nevada economy workforce
 - Including key industry trainers
- LEAP Career Pathway: Education
- Education always struggles to keep up. This is an approach to be proactive.
