WHAT WE'RE DOING TO CONSERVE WATER

Assembly Bill 356

Requires the removal of nonfunctional turf by 2027 which will save this community billions of gallons in irrigation water each year.

- Golf courses
- Landscaping
- Development and cooling
- Septic systems
- Pools

HOW SOUTHERN NEVADANS CAN HELP

- ✓ Follow the mandatory watering schedule and reduce watering on September 1 to your three assigned watering days.
- ✓ Replace nonfunctional grass now while rebate dollars are available.
- ✓ Report water waste when you see it to your local utility.
